## Life in Britain Today

#### Food

British people like good food and more than half of them go to a restaurant every month. Fast food is also very popular – 30% of all adults have a burger every three months, but 46% have fish and chips!

#### Sport

British people don't do a lot of sport. Only 17% of people go swimming every week, 9% go cycling and 8% play golf. Football is the most popular sport in Britain; 10% of the population play it and 46% watch it.

#### **Cinema and TV**

Films are very popular in Britain and about 60% of people between 15 and 24 go to the cinema every month. At home, men watch TV for about 28 hours every week – two hours more than women.



#### **Holidays**

British people love going on holiday and have 56 million holidays a year. The most popular holiday destinations in the UK are Cornwall, Devon, Somerset, Dorset and the South Coast.

British people also like to go abroad on holiday; 27% go to Spain, 10% go to the USA and 9% go to France. Maybe this is because the weather in Britain isn't always very good!



## AIBO – the electronic pet

What exactly is an AIBO, and why do people love them so much?

An AIBO is a robot dog, about 28 centimetres long and it can do lots of amazing things. For example, it can walk, run, play with a ball, be happy or sad – just like a real dog! It can also dance, sing songs, see colours and take photographs like a camera!

A new (or 'baby') AIBO can't see or hear, but it can understand about 40 words and phrases like *How old are*

# The Kennedys

John F Kennedy is probably the most famous President in American history, but the story of the Kennedy family is not a happy one.

John was born in Boston, USA in 1917. The Kennedys were a big family and John had five sisters and three brothers. His father, Joseph Kennedy, was a businessman and his



mother Rose was the daughter of a politician.



# The only way to travel

In 1865, a Belgian man, Georges Nagelmackers, had an idea. He wanted to build a train to travel across Europe and into Asia. Nagelmackers saw Pullman's sleeper cars on the trains in America. Passengers slept on the journey and it was comfortable. Nagelmackers decided to design a train with sleeper cars for Europe. He wanted his train to be fantastic—like a really good hotel inside.

On 4th October, 1883, his train departed from the train station the *Gare de Strasbourg* in Paris. It was called *The Orient Express*. Everybody wanted to travel on *The Orient Express*. Famous passengers were King Ferdinand of Bulgaria, King Leopold the 3rd of Belgium and Czar Nicholas the 2nd of Russia. There were also lots of journalists on the train.

The journey went from Paris in France to Istanbul in Turkey, and it took four days. The first passengers enjoyed the journey so much that everyone wanted to travel on *The Orient Express*.

You can travel on *The Orient Express* today, but it isn't the original one.





There are also two beautiful mosques very near the Palace; the Sancta Sophia and the famous Blue Mosque. Most visitors to Istanbul go shopping in the city's biggest market, the 'Grand Bazaar'. There are more than four thousand shops there and you can buy books, food, clothes, flowers and carpets. The food in Istanbul is great and the city has some fantastic fish restaurants. So, come and visit Istanbul – the city where Asia meets Europe!

#### Hong Kong

You can't visit Hong Kong without shopping! There are many beautiful department stores, boutiques and markets in Hong Kong where you can buy everything from food and clothes to interesting souvenirs. Hong Kong is also great for eating out. There are over 11,000 restaurants in Hong Kong, so you can eat wonderful Chinese food in a different place every day. Hong Kong is a busy place, but there are many parks and other quiet places where you can sit and look at the fantastic views. Come and visit Hong Kong ... there's nowhere like it!


